INTRODUCTION: MOUNTAIN saims at a lively view of current poetry. Fight issues will be published in the group, at 2 to 3 month intervals. Each will contain 40 pages full of poems by poets, the odd book review, and a short (if you're lucky) editorial. At the end of the 16 months, the faithful reader should have something to keep, still on the pages or in his heart.

How to be a faithful reader? If you are not interested in MOUNTAIN, pass it on to someone else. That's faith (among other things). If you are interested, and want to receive the remaining 7, the usual acknowledgment is 4\$, payable in money or work.

At the moment there are almost 200 blank pages in the remaining 7 issues. If you are among the 50% of poetry readers who write you should send along a weighty sample of your work. MOUNTAIN has very definite and rigid editorial standards, but they about from day to day
